Forget Meursault and Montrachet. It's time for Mâconnais

> There are still wines available from the super-talented, lowsulphur Bret Brothers at La Soufriandère from both Berry Bros and Stannary Wine, the retail arm of importers Flint. Not the especially stunning Les Quarts bottling, about which I wrote at Berry's tasting, "Probably difficult to put in the Mâconnais if served blind. Almost painful acidity!", but the regular Pouilly-Vinzelles (£288 for 12, also available in useful magnums), St-Véran, La Combe Desroches (£240 for 12, also in magnum) and Mâcon-Vinzelles, Clos de Grand Père (£240 for 12) are all still on offer from Berry Bros. Stannary are offering three of their wines in sixes, from £144 to £180.

<u>SAINT-VERAN CUVEE « LA COMBE DESROCHES » 2021</u> **Score : 16+** Rich nose and extremely tense palate. Good potential.

<u>SAINT-VERAN CLIMAT « LA BONNODE » 2021</u> **Score : 16+** Rich yet tense with a great texture and some kumquat flavour. Interesting!

## POUILLY-VINZELLES CLIMAT 2021 Score 16.5+

Quite rich and broad but still with lots of energy and acidity.

## POUILLY-VINZELLES CLIMAT « LES QUARTS » 2021 Score : 17

Rather light nose after the young-vine cuvée! Then very juicy and cool and refreshing. Probably difficult to put in the Mâconnais if served blind. Almost painful acidity!

## POUILLY-FUISSE CLIMAT « EN CHATENAY » ZEN 2021 Score : 16.5+

Broad and flashy – dramatic but perhaps not that classic. Though extremely tense. Grapefruit-peel texture and flavour!
